1. Introduction and Definition of the Discipline

Roller Freestyle competitions are judged events, in which riders are scored based upon their skill at executing a routine, including one or more of a variety of different manoeuvres, that are known as “tricks”.

Within the context of these regulations, Roller Freestyle competitions shall refer to RollerFreestyle Park, Roller Freestyle Street and Roller Freestyle Vert Ramp.

The season for Roller Freestyle shall begin on 1st January and end on 31st December.



2. International Officials

2.1. International Judges/Referees

2.1.1. Composition of the Jury and tasks

A panel consisting of 3 to 6 judges (including a head judge) shall be appointed to each Roller Freestyle Competition. They shall independently evaluate the performance of each rider based upon the judging criteria

One of these Judges may be designated as the Head Judge by World Skate for international events, or by the competent national federation for national events.

The Head Judge is responsible for the work of the Panel of Judges, and shall ensure that riders are scored, that those scores are delivered, that ties are broken, the procedures set by these regulations are respected.

The judges must act in a professional and impartial manner, and in doing so must put aside all preconceptions such as style preferences, or past performances. The performance of each rider during each run shall be judged entirely on its own merits.

No scores shall be released as official until verified and approved by the panel of judges or the head judge. No individual judges scores can be shared, only the average score made by all the judges can be shared and considered as official results. The judges are not allowed to talk and share the personal or other judges scores.

No riders nor their family members, team representatives, members of the press, nor spectators should approach the judges stand or speak with the judges during the competition or when calculating scores.

All Competition officials shall operate from a position that allows them to see as much of the FOP as possible. They may adjust their position if need be.

2.1.2. The announcer

The Announcer is responsible for informing the riders and the spectators about the progress of the competition. In doing so, he/she shall work with and be bound by the instructions of World Skate, the organization and the head judge.

In no way can the words of the announcer be considered as an official result, decision or obligation of the organiser, the Commissaire or the Panel of Judges.

3. International Athletes

3.1. Categories Gender

World Skate will consider junior those athletes that are under 17 years of age by 31st December of the year of competition.

A rider older than the Junior category criteria can't register in the Junior category.

A rider which is considered by age as a Junior can choose by himself to register in the Pro category.

Each rider registered in one category will not be able to change his category during the season. The points regarding the overall or yearly ranking will be affected only to the category selected by the rider during his first yearly registration.

These categories shall be held at all events registered on the World Skate Roller Freestyle International Calendar.

3.1.1. Roller Freestyle Park

Categories for Men:

- Pro Men
- Junior Men

Categories for Women:

- Pro Women
- Junior Women

3.1.2. Roller Freestyle Vert

Categories for Men:

- Pro Men

Categories for Women:

- Pro Women

3.1.3. Roller Freestyle Street

Categories for Men:

- Pro Men
- Junior Men

Categories for Women:

- Pro Women
- Junior Women

3.1.4. National Categories

These categories shall be held at all events registered on a Roller Freestyle national calendar.

3.2. Ages of Participants

For participation in events on the international calendar, riders categories are determined by the age of those competing. A rider's age is defined by the difference between the year of the event and the year of birth of the rider. A rider must be at least 7 years of age to compete in a Roller Freestyle event. The minimum age of 7 refers to the real calendar age on the day of event commencement.

3.2.1. Roller Freestyle Park

Categories:

- Junior: 17 years old and down
- Pro: 18 years old and up

3.2.2. Roller Freestyle Vert

Category:

- Pro: 18 years old and up

3.2.3. Roller Street

Categories:

- Junior: 17 years old and down
- Pro: 18 years old and up

3.3. Combination of Categories

A Roller Freestyle competition can only be held for categories in which 3 or more riders have completed the registration and riders' confirmation process. In case a category has less than 3 riders registered and confirmed, that category may be combined with a different category at the discretion of the competition organiser.

If an adequate number of 3 riders are registered and confirmed during the riders confirmation, the category will be run even if less riders show up at the start, for whatever reason.

4. International Competitions

4.1. International Events sanctioned by World Skate

World Skate may sanction and/or recognize events organized by different bodies or entities, providing those events with dignity of official World Skate recognized events. These events shall be included in World Skate Events Calendar. Sanctioned events are international events not organized directly by World Skate.

Here below the procedure to follow for the sanctioning by World Skate. An official request must be sent to Sports Department by email (sportsdepartment@worldskate.org) specifying mandatory information:

- Name of the event
- Discipline
- Location, city/country
- Days of the event
- Typology of the event (Continental event, World Event...)
- Number of Participants Esteemed
- Number International Judges/ Referees
- Competition Format and Schedule
- Which will be the award provided for the competition (Medals, Trophies or Price money)

As Sports Department receives the info requested, they will be sent to the Technical Commission for the approval of the Chairman. In the case of the positive answer, Sports Department will send the **Terms & Conditions**.

4.1.1. Competition Rules

4.1.1.1. Registration and rider confirmation

Riders confirmation is a process carried out under the responsibility of the organization, by which registered riders complete the registration process. The organization shall have the exclusive authority to decide whether a rider's entry is valid or not.

Riders confirmation is done at the times and place described in the Technical Guide or when the start list is shared on course.

During riders confirmation, each rider or their representative must attend to confirm the intention to start in the event.

Every rider by register at the event also accept the World Skate Rules and event regulations. (World Skate Code of Conduct and Code of Ethics)

A valid World Skate license issued by the National Federation may be required and must be shown at riders' confirmation to verify the identity. A national identity card or passport may also be required.



A rider is considered correctly registered for the competition if he has complied with the following requirements:

- payment of the registration fee (if any)
- signature of the waiver requested by the organizers
- completion of the riders confirmation

At this point will he be given the accreditation that allows him to take part in the event.

A rider must have completed the registration in order to access the first practice; no rider is admitted to the competition area before completing the registration process

No further entries shall be accepted following the end of riders' confirmation. Likewise, all riders who have registered but have not participated in the riders confirmation meeting must be removed from the list of entries and are not allowed to start.

A rider whose licence could not be verified and whose status as a non-suspended licence holder cannot be established in any other manner, may not start and may not figure in the classification of the event.

4.1.2. Event Format

For Men and Women Elite, the World Skate Roller Freestyle Park Cup events are organized as described in 5.1.1 or the organiser can define different quota and limits for each competition phase by announcing the details in the official bulletins.

4.1.3. Competition Format

4.1.3.1. *Qualification Phase*

The start list order and composition of the heats are done in reverse order of the current Roller Freestyle World Cup ranking. The final ranking of the previous year is used in the case of the first event of the season. Any riders not ranked will start before the ranked riders, in a randomly determined order. Scores for all riders competing in the Qualification phase are published no later than 90 minutes after the Qualification phase is finished.

4.1.3.2. *Semi-final Phase*

The start order of the Semi-final phase is done in first in reverse order of the results of the Qualification phase.

In the Semi-final, the scores will be reported by the judges no later than 30 minutes following the end of the Semi-final.



4.1.3.3. Final Phase

The riders who advance to the Final will be seeded in reverse order of the Qualification or Semi-final results (highest ranked rider from the Semi-final goes last).

In case one or more riders do not start or are disqualified in the Final, regardless of the reason, the final will be run with less riders. No other riders can enter to the final afterward. In the Final, the scores will be reported by the judges following each heat or following each run if any live scoring system is offered by the organization.

4.1.3.4. Delays

If an event is delayed, all athletes and staff must stay at the competition venue until informed otherwise by the organizer. The riders will be notified of the new schedule as soon as it has been decided. Riders are responsible to read the schedule and for checking to see if it has been amended. Neither the World Skate nor the organizer shall not be responsible in case a rider misses the competition due to a change.

4.1.3.5. Schedule Changes

In case the event is stopped and can't be resumed before the Qualification phase is finished, then there shall be no result. The organizer and World Skate acting jointly may decide to change the schedule before the start of the event. During the event the Technical Delegate (if appointed) and organizer, acting jointly, will decide together if the schedule must be changed. If there is a schedule change prior to the first day of practice, the adjusted schedule will be posted on the event web site (if any), on World Skate's website and at the competition venue. In case of a change during the event, the revised schedule will be posted, at minimum, at the competition venue.

In case the schedule must be altered the competition, format may be altered as follows: The Qualification phase may not be held, in which case all entered riders will start in the Semi-final round (or Final, in the case of no Semi Final scheduled). The Semi-final phase may not be held, and only a Final held. If the Final is not held, the results of the Semi-final will be used as results of the event for the prize money and overall series points (or the Qualification phase). If an entire event is stopped and can't be resumed before the conclusion of the Qualification phase, neither prizes nor points will be awarded. In this case, a meeting will be called with the riders to inform them.



4.1.4. Awards Ceremony

All riders concerned shall participate in official ceremonies, in accordance with their placing, classifications and performances. If a concerned rider is not showing up at the Ceremony his prize money may be cancelled at the discretion of the organization.

Unless otherwise stated, riders must show up at official ceremonies wearing competition clothing or decent clothes.

4.2. World Cup

General Terms Applicable to the World Skate Roller Freestyle Cup.

A ranking consisting of all events in the World Skate Roller Freestyle Cup series shall be drawn up for Pro Men and for Pro Women.

Points will be awarded based on the final ranking for each event, according to the schedule found in annex 1. The ranking shall be updated following each event. In case of a tie on points on the yearly series (World Cup) ranking, the rider with the better result in the final classification of the latest round held shall break the tie.

Following the last event in the World Skate ROLLER Freestyle Cup Series each season, the highest ranked rider in Pro Men and Pro Women will be declared the World Skate ROLLER Freestyle Cup Winner, respectively, for the year in question.

4.3. World Championships

General Terms Applicable to the World Skate Roller Freestyle Cup.

Registration, Limited country quota, Qualification process and any specific rules for the Roller Freestyle World Championships will be held and shared on specific bulletin sent to national federations and shared on the World Skate website.

5. Technical Rules

5.1. General rules of the competitions

5.1.1. Competition Format

A Roller Freestyle competition for each category may be composed of the phases (Qualification, Semi-final or Final) described below. Within each phase, a certain number of heats take place.

A heat is a group which includes 3 to 6 riders.

The combination of phases and heats for a category depends on the number of entries, and is specified in the following table:

5.1.2. Number of heats

The number of heats in each round is found in the table above. For the Qualification phase, the number of heats should be chosen such that as many heats as possible have 4 to 6 riders. Whenever it is not possible for all heats to have 4 to 6 riders, there will be either heats of 5 or heats of 3, whichever must be done to maximize the number of heats with 6 riders.

5.1.3. Number of runs

In all competition phases, within each heat, each rider shall do 1 to 3 runs. A run is the individual unit of competition in a Roller Freestyle event, during which a rider performs a routine consisting of various tricks, which is evaluated by the judges. The number of runs and number of run counting for the results should be announced on the technical guide.

Classic competition format is 2 runs best run counts. Any other competition format needs to be approved by the World Skate Technical Commission.

5.1.4. Start Order

Each rider must perform a single run according to the starting order. Once the last runner in the order within each run has taken his first run, the riders will take their second run in the same order.

Within the Qualification phase, riders are randomly assigned to each heat.

However, in case an event that is part of a series, the Qualification phase shall be done in reverse order of the current series ranking. Riders are assigned to their heats in order, starting with the unranked or lowest ranked riders, and ending with the highest ranked riders in the last heat.

In such a case, within each heat, the start order continues to be in reverse order of ranking, so that the highest ranked rider within each heat goes last in that heat. Any unranked riders are seeded randomly in the first heats.

In case of the first event in a series, the final ranking of the previous season of the series will be used.

Within the Semi-final phase (if done), the start order is in reverse order of the results of the Qualification phase.

Within the Final phase, the start order is in reverse order of the results of the previous phase.

Within each phase of the competition, the riders in each heat are entitled to a minimum 40 second warm-up before their heat begins.

In the Semi-final (if held) and the Final, any rider who is not present within the

park or the riders area as described in the Technical Guide at latest by the start of the 15 minute warm-up period preceding that phase, shall not be allowed to start. They will be scored as DNS (“Did Not Start”) for the phase in question.

In case one or more riders do not start in a Semi-final or the Final for the reason of missing the deadline, the heats shall be redrawn.

In case one or more riders withdraw (or are disqualified or refused their start) once the deadline has passed, the heats will not be changed.

5.1.5. Riders Meeting

The place and time of the Riders Meeting will be announced via World Skate Bulletin or by an official communication from the Judges and the Organizer.

5.2. Field of play

Roller Freestyle Park Competitions take place within a course that consists of various types of obstacles such as ramps, walls, and railings. Riders perform their routines within the course, and are scored based upon various factors, including the difficulty and quality of execution of their run. The course used can be a slopestyle course or a park.

Roller Freestyle Vert Ramp Competitions take place on a vert Ramp. Riders perform timed routines within the course, and are scored based upon various factors, including the difficulty and quality of execution of their run.

Roller Freestyle Street Competitions take place on a Street Park. Riders perform timed routines within the course, and are scored based upon various factors, including the difficulty and quality of execution of their run.

5.3. The judging criteria

Roller Freestyle Park :

The performance of each rider/run is judged on overall impression including, but not limited to:

- Difficulty (refers to not only the tricks performed but also the placement of the tricks within the course and the combinations used)
- Height (amplitude of the tricks performed)
- Flow
- Fluidity
- Originality, Creativity (tricks, lines and diversity)
- Style

- Consistency (refers the stability, fluidity and control of manoeuvres performed)
- Variety of tricks (refers to a good mix of standard airs, rotations, grinds and more)
- Landings (foot trailing, imbalance, half turn,...)
- Control of the tricks
- Use of the Park
- Execution
- Progression (evolution of the Sport)

Roller Freestyle Street:

The performance of each rider/run is judged on overall impression including, but not limited to:

- Difficulty (refers to not only the tricks performed but also the placement of the tricks within the course and the combinations used)
- Flow
- Fluidity
- Originality, Creativity (tricks, lines and diversity)
- Style
- Consistency (refers the stability, fluidity and control of manoeuvres performed)
- Variety of tricks (refers to a good mix of standard airs, rotations, grinds and more)
- Landings (foot trailing, imbalance, half turn,...)
- Control of the tricks
- Use of the Street Park
- Execution
- Progression (evolution of the Sport)

Roller Freestyle Vert Ramp:

The performance of each rider/run is judged on overall impression including, but not limited to:

- Difficulty (refers to not only the tricks performed but also the placement of the tricks within the course and the combinations used)
- Height (amplitude of the tricks performed)
- Flow
- Fluidity
- Originality, Creativity (tricks, lines and diversity)
- Style
- Consistency (refers the stability, fluidity and control of manoeuvres performed)
- Variety of tricks (refers to a good mix of standard airs, rotations, grinds and more)
- Landings (foot trailing, imbalance, half turn,...)
- Control of the tricks
- Use of the Park
- Execution
- Progression (evolution of the Sport)



For all disciplines and categories, the overall composition of the runs is most important as the judge evaluates the sequences of tricks, the amount of risk in the routine, and how the rider uses the course.

The judges take errors such as falls and stops into consideration as described below. Errors are defined as interruptions in a run or losses of control such as those listed below.

- Minor errors can include flat landings, deck landings, sliding, light hand touches and other instabilities. Medium errors can include stopping in full or heavy hand touches,
- Major errors can include actions such as big crashing

Each judge will take into consideration any mistakes as fall, stops, hand down, ... The number of points deducted depends on the quantity and severity of the errors, and their overall impact on the rider's run performance.

In case of a tie, the judges shall discuss the performance of each rider concerned and break the tie and will decide which rider had the better performance before reporting the scores in question.

5.4. Procedure for Managing the Competition

5.4.1. Starting a Run

Riders may begin their run from any position and must be ready in their chosen starting position prior to beginning their run.

The time for each run will be started when in the opinion of the *technical delegate* or

commission the rider drops in from an obstacle or higher level of the park. In this regard, the decision of the responsible for timekeeping shall be final and may not be protested.

5.4.2. Finishing a Run

A run ends when the time for the run has elapsed.

If a rider is stationary when the time runs out, nothing else will be scored.

If a rider is in motion when the time runs out, any remaining trick that is fully completed within 2 seconds after the time elapses shall be counted.

Completed trick is one in which both skates are in contact with a flat (horizontal) part of the park surface.

A run can be from 45 to 60 seconds.

5.4.3. Time-out for Mechanical Problems

During a run, if a rider suffers any kind of a mechanical problem, the rider has until the time elapses for his run to either fix the problem or to get another roller and continue riding. If the time for his run elapses before he continues riding, then his run shall be declared finished, and he shall not be allowed to start riding again. Whether or not the rider is able to restart his run before the time elapses, the judges shall only consider any riding that was done within the time limit.

5.4.4. Delay

The Judges, together with the organiser and technical commission, may decide based on their assessment of the riding conditions whether or not a weather time-out is necessary.

The judges, together with the organiser, may decide based on their assessment of the riding conditions whether or not a competition can be finished.

If the competition is stopped at any point during a run series (1st or 2nd run for the complete heat), then the entire run series (1st or 2nd run for the complete heat) shall be re-run once the competition is started again. However, the results of any heats that have been fully run before the competition was stopped shall stand; no such heats will be re-run.

If the competition can't be later restarted, the last scores from semi final or qualification will be the results.

For whatever reason, in case a competition can't be finished after it has started, the results of the last phase completed shall form the final result.

5.4.5. Cancellation

If the competition is stopped before the Qualification phase is completed, there shall be no result. In this case, no prizes and no points will be awarded.

5.5. Scoring and Results

5.5.1. Scoring system

Each judge shall give each rider a score of between 0.01 and 99.99, taking into account the rider's entire performance.

The scores given by all judges for each rider are then averaged; this average

score is the official score of the rider. No individual scores can be shared or analyzed, only the average scores of the panel of judges are official.

Within each phase it is possible that one or more riders may not start or withdraw from competition.

In case a rider is refused his start for any reason or withdraws or simply does not show up before beginning their first run, he shall be scored as “Did Not Start” for the phase in

question. Such a rider is not eligible to transfer to the next phase of the competition. Should a rider withdraw after completing part of his first or second run, he shall be considered as having started in that phase of the competition and will be scored on the portion of the run(s) that he was able to complete before withdrawing.

In case a rider registered for the competition does not show up at the competition venue for a Semi-final or Final within the timelines, their DNS shall be converted to a disqualification unless the rider withdraws for an acceptable reason such as injury a circumstance beyond one's control. It is the responsibility of the rider or their representative to contact the organisation and provide acceptable proof of this.

5.5.2. Results for Each Phase

No scores shall be released as official until verified and approved by the panel of Judges or the supervisor (if any).

No riders nor their family members, team representatives, members of the press, nor

spectators should approach the judges stand or speak with the judges during the competition or when calculating scores.

The judges must act in a professional and impartial manner, and in doing so must put aside all preconceptions such as style preferences, or past performances. The performance of each rider during each run shall be judged entirely on its own merits.

Within each phase, a result shall be established in order of the highest score to the lowest. Ties shall be broken.

5.5.3. Non-starters and Withdrawing from Competition

Within the results established for each phase, riders who are scored as DNS (“Did Not Start”) are put in last place for the phase in question.

In case of multiple DNS riders, they will be placed after the riders who started, in the order of their results in the previous phase.

In case one or more riders do not start in the Qualification phase, they shall automatically be considered as Disqualified (DSQ) and will not be ranked in the final results of the competition.

After the Final of a Roller Freestyle Competition is completed, a competition classification accounting for the results of all phases of the event is produced as follows:

All riders not Disqualified (DSQ) who qualified for the Final, in order of their scores in the Final (from highest score to lowest). DNS riders in the Final as described below.

If it was held, all riders not Disqualified (DSQ) who qualified for the Semi- final but did not qualify for the Final, in order of their scores in the Semi- final (from highest score to lowest). DNS riders in the Semi-final as described below.

If it was held all riders not Disqualified (DSQ) who started in the Qualification phase, in order of their scores in the Qualification phase, but who did not qualify for the next phase of the competition.

5.6. Clothing and equipment

5.6.1. Roller Freestyle Equipement

Equipement used in Roller Freestyle Competitions shall comply with the spirit and principle of considering the Roller Freestyle as a sport. This principle presupposes that riders will compete in competitions on a level playing field. The principle affirms the primacy of man over the machine.

The Roller skates and their accessories used in Roller Freestyle Competitions shall be of a type that is adequate for use by anyone practising Roller Freestyle as a sport.

It is up to each rider to check the conformity of their equipment.

The judges, the technical commission and the organization have the authority to refuse any equipment that could endanger the safety of the rider or any other person.

The roller skates used in Roller Freestyle Competitions are with at least two wheels of equal or different diameter per foot. The wheels shall be put together and assembly on bearings without electric or other assistance.

However, for various reasons, riders in Roller Freestyle Competitions may decide to build their Roller with 2 to 5 wheels per foot.

Wheels should be set on a frame.

The Roller skates used in Roller Freestyle Competitions shall be of a type that is generally used for Roller Freestyle. This position requires that the only points of support can be the following: 2 feet placed on 2 different skates.

All Roller Skates used in Roller Freestyle Competitions must be equipped with wheels that are nominally a minimum of 40 millimeters in diameter to a maximum of 130 millimeters in diameter per wheels.

5.6.2. Safety Equipment

Wearing a helmet certified for Roller Freestyle is an obligation attached to all categories. This helmet must be worn at all times while riding. Only

accessories approved by the helmet manufacturer may be attached to helmets. The helmet strap must be securely fastened at all times when riding, whether during competition, warm-up or practice.

It is strongly recommended that riders wear:

Back, elbow, knee and wrist protectors

Protection of the cervical vertebrae

For riders in any Youth category, knee protection is mandatory.

5.6.3. Clothing

Riders in Roller Freestyle Competitions shall wear clothing that is traditionally associated

with Roller Freestyle. Such clothing in its design or construction must not constitute a danger to the safety of the rider (example: extremely loose clothing which could get caught in the field of play).

Likewise, the design or advertising printed on such clothing must not contain any offensive statement or image which could damage the public image of the organiser, World Skate, nor of Roller Freestyle as a sport.

5.6.4. Identification of Riders

Riders must at all times wear the visual identification provided by the organisation (sticker, wristband, bib or strap, whatever the case may be). Riders not doing so may be refused access to the competition venue or may be refused their start.

6. Anti-Doping Rules

Roller Freestyle as an official World Skate sport follows the World Skate anti-doping rules and measures listed on the World Skate website as follows: <https://www.worldskate.org/clean-sport.html>

7. Disciplinary actions & disputes

7.1. Participant code of conduct

Each participant is engaged on their own or on behalf of employees and agents and must respect the World Skate Code of Conduct and Code of Ethics.

Anyone who signs the registration form declares to have been informed and to accept the Regulations, Bulletin, Code of Conduct and Code of Ethics of World Skate.

Fair play and respect are two essential values at all World Skate Roller Freestyle events. Without prejudice to any specific provisions of these regulations, the organization and judges appointed to manage a Roller Freestyle competition has the right to disqualify or refuse the start of a rider who violates the following standards of safety or good conduct:

- Failure to respect the equipment regulations.
- Failure to respect the published event schedule.
- Failure to respect restricted areas or the time limits of the competition.
- Failure to respect the start order for the competition deliberately causing damage to equipment, the venue, or the environment.
- Participating in the event (regardless of the stage) under the influence of alcohol or other illegal substances and not respecting WADA rules.
- Inadequate behavior (eg: use of obscenities, insults, inappropriate language, obscene gestures)
- Any other behaviour that would prejudice the fair conduct of the competition or damage the reputation of the sport, the organisation, or World Skate.

Without prejudice to any other disciplinary measures that may apply, in relation to this point neither verbal nor physical aggression will be tolerated; exclusion from the competition or event area will be immediate.

The decision of the organisation or the technical commission for disqualifying or refusing the start of a rider can not be protested.
